In like a lion, out like a lamb, or vice versa? The month of March passes through the season of Lent along the path to the cross when we shall hear again of the ministry of Jesus. The work He achieved in the transformation of many lives, and also the malicious work of those who were totally opposed to His Word. We shall be reminded of Jesus's suffering and of His compassionate love to all he reached out to. A love which was embodied in His suffering and death, as He released us from sin and procured our salvation.

During Lent we are called to meditate on these things: to assess our lives; to acknowledge our flaws; to seek the healing presence of God in His Son; to renew our desire for a personal relationship with Jesus. The discipline of Bible reading and prayer-time every day for six weeks can be hard if we are not used to spending that level of time with our Lord.

It is a popular concept, even among those who are not particularly spiritual, to give something up for lent, but is it to deepen our spiritual health or to benefit us physically? Many years ago I remember all the girls in the office where I worked, willingly giving up sweets, of which many were usually consumed. We bought and shared our usual quantities, but put them by until the end of Lent. These were parcelled up and given to any folk we knew who could do with a treat. It was an admirable exercise, but I doubt many of us really understood the deeper meaning of Lent.

Are we willing to make a disciplined promise to give more time on a daily basis to Jesus during Lent? If there is a Lent Group available, it is well worth sharing Lent with others, growing together in the knowledge of Jesus and our salvation. And after Lent, perhaps a new joy in the Lord and the awakenig of a new desire to serve Him.

May Lent this year be a rich and blessed time for us all.
