Letter from the Rector - Revd Canon David Longe 577252 / 07881 950294 / djhlonge@gmail.com

Dear All

In the middle of January, I decided to walk our seven parishes. I set off from Matlaske at about 8.45am for Plumstead and found myself walking into a headwind; as I strode out of Plumstead down Jericho Lane into Little Barningham (which is just outside the Benefice) it started to snow; making it over Matlaske Road, down Monks Lane it rained but a kind person took pity

on me with my first restorative cup of tea (mint). Revived I continued from Saxthorpe crossing the Bure into Corpusty then over the fields – another bitter headwind – to Edgefield; from here winding through the beautiful woods to Hempstead as the sun began, I traipsed on to Baconsthorpe then Barningham where, revived again by a second cup of tea, I made it home.

As I walked, I prayed, I gave thanks for the beauty of God's creation, for the wind, the rain, even as it whipped into my face and I drove my hands deeper into my pockets. In the churches where I stopped



for shelter, I gave thanks for their beauty and stillness, powerfully pointing to something greater than myself. I suspect my gratitude for the cups of tea was rather gushing, as they were so fortifying (thank you again to my two tea brewers!).

What struck me too as I wandered was the work we do to keep our communities as communities, rather than just dormitories. One hundred years ago I would have met more people on my walk, yet our communities have changed with the closure of shops and pubs, we see and interact with our neighbours less and in some of our villages the only central meeting place left is the church.

Our community interaction is now often centred around events (such as those listed in this magazine), organised by an incredible hardworking group of people who work tirelessly to bring us together. These gatherings are vital as humans are not designed to live in isolation for at the very core of our being is our desire to socialise.

One such community activity is the Diocesan Play Van that for many years has been providing fun for children and a central place for parents and carers to socialise in Baconsthorpe. (I try and drop in each week.) The idea behind the play van is that it sets up a playgroup that is eventually run by the community. We are lucky it has been with us so long, but now the time has come that either the community run it or it stops. If anyone reading this is interested in taking on the playgroup, do let me know.

So, as spring fast approaches, I pray you may be able to stop and consider the beauty of creation; and consider too how we can keep our communities thriving, as we all have a part to play in this world in which we live.



Those entitled to have their names on this roll have to be 16 years of age or more and they must reside in the relevant

parish or be regular worshippers in church whose roll they wish to join. Application forms are available from Eleanor and need to be completed and returned by 7th March.

Annual Parochial Church Meeting, Wednesday 27th March, 4 pm. All are welcome to attend, but only those on the electoral roll may stand for office or vote in church matters.

The village has experienced its first case of vandalism for some years. As I write this month's column, we hit double figures outside! Despite the blue sky and mild temperatures, I am thinking of the record low temperatures that America has been struggling with these last few days. My Gran always used to say after any big snow in America we would get the same a fortnight later. We shall see!

March I feel is an optimistic month: we've made it through February and March can give you a proper sense of the year finally turning out of winter... thank goodness!

OK: tasks for a sunny but chilly day. If you have fruit trees they would benefit from a good mulch, make sure you weed well round them first and don't mulch right up to the bark, as trees need excess moisture to be able to drain away, so if the mulch is right up against the bark it can cause bark decay - not what you want. Another good job is to finish off pruning your roses. If you're feeling less than confident, here is how I go about it: firstly, be confident! Don't be scared! Your aim with your pruning is to have an open middle. This ensures air can move around, which in turn helps prevent disease. You need to remove any branches that cross, because if branches cross, they can rub, thus again causing the potential for disease. When you do cut the offending branches, ensure you cut to an outward facing bud. If you chose an inward facing bud, you will be creating the reverse of what you are after which is an open outward framework. When you make your cut, it needs to be at 45 degrees away from the bud, to ensure any water that collects drains away from the bud and helps prevent rot. Now for the brave part! You need to remove any branches older than two years old. This will help maintain the vigour of your rose, and vigorous roses will give you a better show and resist disease more robustly too. Rose lecture over! All that's left to say is that weather permitting, you could set your first early potatoes and onion sets, but that is as long as it's not too cold and damp... fingers crossed!

This month's question comes from Miss C Trench, who asks should I cut down the foliage on my hellebores in early spring? In my opinion, yes you should! Cutting back the foliage helps prevent leaf spot disease and you will get nice fresh foliage.
