#### Letter from the Rector - Revd Canon David Longe 577252 / 07881 950294 / rector@matlaske.org.uk

#### Dear All

I want to start by thanking the Beale family for permission to mention what follows in this letter.

In the church of Santa Maria Novella in Florence there is a painting of the crucifixion by Masaccio, who died only aged 26 or 27 in 1428. The painting, known as the The Trinity, from afar looks like a 'normal' crucifixion painting, with the three women, Mary (Jesus Mother), Mary Magdalene, and Mary the wife of Cleopas, as well as St John standing at the foot of the cross. Certainly, when I first saw this painting twenty years ago that was all I saw. But as you approach the painting you see another figure. A bearded figure standing behind the crucified Christ. And as you come even closer you see that the figure has his hands underneath the arms of Christ.

The figure – a human image of God – is holding his son, Jesus, as he bears the pain of the cross. Between them, harder to see, there is an image of the dove, representing the Holy Spirit. Hence the one picture contains the Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Why we must ask (not to ask would not be to use our God-given facilities) is this virus causing such havoc and such tragedy? Where (we must also ask) is this apparently loving Christian God? On the face of it, God seems absent from all the difficulties we are encountering.

So far as I am aware, I remain incredibly fortunate that none of my family appear to have been affected by the virus. Yet these last few weeks I have encountered several families in our community who have had to face extraordinarily tough circumstances. They have had to watch as those closest to them suffer the most awful symptoms.

When I telephoned the Beale family last week to offer my condolences, I was amazed at their response. For within their sadness at losing a beloved father, grandfather, and greatgrandfather, there was an incredible gratitude for those had cared for him. The description of the care that was given was way beyond the call of duty. It was loving, tender and gentle. The family could not stop singing the praises of the staff.

We have been told again and again of how outstanding the caring profession is being, particular the NHS. Their bravery, courage, and resilience will be remembered for many years to come. Our tribute on a Thursday evening is important (and proving entertaining – Jonathan Cooper's uplifting music is blasted out over the roofs of Baconsthorpe) yet it seems insignificant compared to the magnitude of their sacrifice.

So where is God in this we must ask again? Is God there? Has God forgotten us?

In St Matthew's Gospel Jesus is recorded as having said from the cross: "My God, My God why have your forsaken me?" He was at a loss, it was the end.

God I believe did not forsake Jesus; and neither does he forsake us. The God revealed in the tender child in Bethlehem and cared for by a young, woman from Nazareth, Mary, is the God who calls us into relationship, where the Divine is continually revealed, even in times of great pain and great tragedy. We discern God's presence at the crucifixion because of the resurrection. Of course it's difficult to believe in the resurrection: Jesus clearly struggled or else we would not attribute those words to him. But believe in it we must: it is our hope. We must believe that we see the Divine revealed daily, in the mundane, in the simple as well as in the complex and unfathomable.

When Kevin relayed to me how his father had been cared for, I felt he had described to me a glimpse and an encounter with the Divine. A glimpse of the hands that held Christ in that picture in that Church in Florence.

For the Divine is not revealed through some flash of light but through, as Kevin so beautifully put it to me, the exceptional care and love that is being shown across the world by those who care for us.

When we clap this Thursday let it sound down our streets and across our fields with a prayer of gratitude for these brave individuals in whom we place our trust.

My prayers are with all who have lost those they love during this epidemic and with those who are suffering at this time: may they all be held in the loving arms of God.





#### **The Village Gardener** To Plant a Garden is to Believe in Tomorrow



For those of us fortunate enough to have a garden then I don't think there is much more solace that can be gained in these tremendously difficult times than by spending time in our own homemade havens. However, my heart really does go out to people who are self-isolating without some outdoor space. We are extremely fortunate to be where we are.


I am sure I am not alone in finding people's rediscovery of their gardens namely their vegetable gardens rather reassuring, if not momentarily frustrating when you try and put your usual seed order in... with that in mind we will start off in the vegetable patch! As I write this we have just had some quite sharp frosts, something to be really wary of until we are properly in May. If you have got plants that are desperate to get out, consider popping them in a cold frame or on a cooler windowsill just to keep them used to colder temperatures and to stop them roaring ahead. Be especially careful of courgette plants: they are so susceptible to frost, other veg plants are less fussy, thank goodness! In the veg patch try and focus on vegetables you really like to eat too, as space will be at a premium now so it's worth really thinking and planning through what you want to grow. There's no point in growing a huge bed of kale if no one in your household likes the stuff. Catch crops are helpful too, so try a row of radishes or cutting lettuce leaves in between slower crops like parsnips etc. Do keep an eye on young seedlings: on bright sunny days it's worth providing them with a bit of shade, especially if they have just been transplanted. However careful you are, they do sustain some root damage, so they just require a bit of care till they have found their feet again. Elsewhere in the garden keep on top of weeds by mulching well. We should soon see some early summer colour which will do us all the power of good.



This month's question is from Cathy Batchelar who says my husband has just given me a lovely little bare-root Victoria Plum tree which I have already planted. My question is would it help the tree establish if I add mulch around the base and if so what should I use? Thanks Cathy – wow, what a fantastic present! I would most certainly water it in well, then mulch to hold in all that water and help the tree settle in the early months, don't ever let it dry out! You can mulch with bark chip, leaf mould, garden compost etc, just be sure not to mulch right up to the stem of the tree, it needs to breathe. Have a fantastic birthday and enjoy your tree!
