**Keeping Going** 

My Dear Friends

First of all, I would like to thank the Wardens, Treasurers and all who do so much to make things happen. We do well to remember that all these good souls are volunteers - and more is expected of them year by year! Do support them.

I don't have many opportunities to listen to other people's sermons very often - but a few weeks ago I heard a really challenging message from a Priest friend of mine who was preaching at the Anglican National Pilgrimage at Walsingham. Father Rowlands reminded us of our individual need, and indeed the church's need, to respond to the call to holiness if we are to share the Good News of the Gospel authentically. I'm sure he was saying that if we spend more time on our knees at worship and less time at meetings we might be on a better footing.

Faithfulness to the life of the church in worship and to wider parish life are all important if parishes are to remain vibrant and viable in the current life of the Church of England. If prayer is offered regularly, day by day, and if people in our multi-parish Benefice are prepared to worship in each other's churches, we shall all receive extra strength.

That numbers are falling nationally, congregations get older and struggle to draw in younger people and financial burdens weigh heavily, and that there do not appear to be vocations to the Priesthood to offset the retirement of the clergy in the next few years, can all sound rather gloomy. But it needn't be! What we can, and must do is to remain prayerful and hopeful. May we be strong enough to play our part in keeping the faith in that part of the kingdom we have been asked to love: that we can be good and faithful servants of the Church, the community and each other - and that through us, God's will shall be done.

The girls were also able to complete their World Issues Badge on 15th May when, with the kind permission of the Corpusty Village Hall Management Committee, they helped to plant a Mountain Ash near the play area on the site. #### Neighbourhood Plan

Neighbourhood planning (NP) gives communities direct power to develop a shared vision for their neighbourhood and shape the development and growth of their local area. NP provides a powerful set of tools for local people to ensure that they get the right types of development for their community where the ambition of the neighbourhood is aligned with the strategic needs and priorities of the wider local area. Corpusty and Saxthorpe were designated a NP Area in 2013.

After five years' work and detailed collaboration with North Norfolk District Council (NNDC), the NP and addenda will go out for final formal consultation for the six-week period 5pm on Monday 25 June and 5pm Monday 6 August. NNDC will announce the consultation in the local press and other media. Copies of the final version of the plan will be available to read in St Andrew's Church, the Old Workshop Gallery and also Holt and Aylsham public libraries. The full report will be available on the Corpusty and Saxthorpe website. After this consultation, the draft plan will be subject to a process of inspection and then - finally - will go before voters in the two villages in the form of a referendum. If passed at referendum Corpusty and Saxthorpe will become a Neighbourhood Planning Area. Much credit is due to Imogen Waterson, Tony Barnett and Andrew Brown for their hard work in taking the NP to this stage.

#### **Community Housing Fund**

At the last Parish Council meeting a presentation was made about the possibility of making a bid to this Fund for the purposes of an exceptional housing scheme, to provide low cost housing. ### The Village Gardener To Plant a Garden is to Believe in Tomorrow



What a beautiful month July can be! I might be crossing my fingers as I type this – as ever with the English quirky climate you can't quite take it for granted...

First stop this month is the kitchen garden. As with June, watering and weeding are key! A handy tip if you are like us growing courgettes this year: slice the base off a plastic water bottle remove the lid and pop into the soil next to your courgette plant (then fill regularly) this insures a good soaking reaches the roots of the courgette and less water is lost due to evaporation – a handy tip if you're on a water meter. Try and get into the habit of successional planting with your lettuces

and green herbs. A few seeds planted every week will keep a nice steady supply, whereas big rows of lettuces will just lead to huge gluts followed by nothing when they have all gone woody and have ended up on your compost heap. Don't forget to net your raspberries or any soft fruits before they ripen. I misjudged our gooseberries last year and one day they were there, then the next the birds had literally stripped the bushes of every last fruit. You have been warned!

If we do manage to have any periods of really dry weather in July, don't be tempted to over mow your lawn. No point in stressing both you and your lawn out.

Try and keep on top of dead-heading your roses... it's not an unpleasant task and if you bear in mind that by removing the old roses you are not only making the bush look perkier but you are also ensuring the plant's energy is going back into the plant to produce more flowers.

Time for this month's questions! Ken Just wants to know when the best time is to divide bearded irises... What impeccable timing, Ken, as the right time to divide them is now! This will ensure they have enough time to re-root well before the weather gets colder.
