

# Letter from the Rector - Revd Canon David Longe 577252 / 07881 950294 / rector@matlaske.org.uk

#### Dear All

A few weeks ago I took advantage of the services being broadcast on YouTube to listen to a colleague. The issue of Black Lives Matter had made the headlines, and I was interested in what my old colleague would say – he was born in the West Indies and is well respected within the church communities.

He spoke of three pandemics: the coronavirus, the environment and racism. As a white male, I wanted to know how I should respond to Black Lives Matter, whether I was capable of understanding the cries that we all hear following the wake of the tragic death of George Floyd. I agree with my friend that we are living through (and I pray will soon emerge from) a pandemic



from a virus that stills poses unknown challenges ahead. I also agree that we must not forget the environmental crisis, noting that some of the plastic waste generated from our response to the virus is having a devastating effect already as it finds itself washed up in our seas.

Black Lives Matters asks us to re-assess and to ask questions: To ask whether racism is still prevalent in British society? Whether in 2020 we have moved so individuals are truly treated as equal? Do we subconsciously make decisions based on what we hear and see?

In his book, Ghost Ship (SCM Press, 2020), A D A France-Williams, a priest from Manchester, describes being invited to preach at St Paul's Cathedral in London. Checking out the venue a few days before he persuades a verger to let him up into the pulpit. As he mounts the steps he surveys the Cathedral, imagining who might be there when he preaches. Then he looks up and he sees the words "For God and Empire". "For some" France-Williams writes, "[these words] would no doubt be a source of pride, a high honour. To me, it was code for supremacy and shame; a reminder of my slave ancestors."

I am not convinced that we should suddenly remove statues or, as has been suggested, alter images of Jesus. Jesus was undoubtedly from the Middle East and Jewish. He lived a life that that welcomed people with a compassion and gentleness that we can all learn from. It didn't matter to him whether they were rich, poor, sick, virtuous or wayward, or whether they were Jew, Roman or Gentile (non-Gentile). For Jesus all were – we all are – God's children.

This inclusive way of thinking challenges us, as does France-Williams's book. It asks us to examine our bias and reminds us to be humble, as we realise that at times our actions may hurt others: what is a celebration for one, may well be a lament for another.

To approach life in this way, is to recognise that truth is an ongoing revelation, and as it is revealed, paraphrase Jesus's words in the Gospel of John, we are all set free (John 8.31).

With my continued prayers for you, your families and friends.

## Norfolk Wartime Remembered The fourth in a series of recollections by Arthur Pentney

#### Baconsthorpe under attack - February 1941

In order to complement the other articles concerning the ending of the war 75 years ago, perhaps now is a good time to recall that day in 1941 when Baconsthorpe was actually bombed by the enemy. I was in a good position to hear a first hand report of this incident as my father and his brother Ernest were working in a field adjacent to the rectory at the time of the attack.

The German aircraft, possibly a Dornier, flew in from the south. Those two workers rapidly dived for cover under a hedge as a stick of bombs were dropped, and the rectory and church machine-gunned.

Being a youngster at the time I was somewhat miffed to hear that my father had taken cover in this way. Why, I thought, did he not stand up and fire his Home Guard sten gun, or let off both barrels of his Church interior with lovely original window that 12-bore at the enemy? No point really, of course, as even if those guns had been readily to hand, this

aircraft was flying at 200 mph, and the whole attack would have been over in just a few seconds. So in hindsight, discretion was certainly the better part of valour on that day.

The fact that the aircraft was flying so low was advantageous, as not all its bombs actually detonated. To explode, a bomb has to be descending vertically, but some hit the ground at an angle and skidded along without exploding. That said, a fair amount of damage was done. Half the Rectory took a direct hit, outbuildings were destroyed, and the large church window blown out. With the bombs now jettisoned, the aircraft now headed rapidly in the direction of the coast, and presumably back to its base in northern France.

Some inhabitants considered the church to have been intended as the real target, but I think this unlikely. I suspect Norwich was a more likely destination for its deadly cargo, but probably the aircraft got lost in some way and decided to dump its bombs anywhere before retuning to base. Herr Goering, the Luftwaffe chief, would not have looked favourably on any of his crews returning with a full payload of bombs still intact, and with machine guns that had not been fired.

The damaged half of the Rectory had to be rebuilt, but not with that lovely pale-coloured Georgian brick. No, utility red brick would have to suffice, which now, almost 80 years on, has mellowed rather well.

I still have one of the cards that was given to me when as school children we were taught to identify aircraft for our own protection. The Dornier, capable of carrying a payload of one ton of bombs, was nicknamed 'The Flying Pencil', which was a good description of it with its slim sideways on profile. I also have a memento of that day – a nasty jagged piece of shrapnel from one of the bombs that did explode. Looking at it now, I can understand just why my father and uncle took refuge under that hedge during the attack.

## The Village Gardener

To Plant a Garden is to Believe in Tomorrow



August is a curious month: there is always a combination of not wanting the summer to end, but the garden can look somewhat jaded in the bright light as if it knows it's on borrowed time. But then we have the gorgeousness of September to come so all is not lost.

Happily there is still plenty to do in the garden, first up is the veg patch. I can report that our really unappealing looking carrot fence has worked, although I appreciate it is early days... Standing at a meter high and made of a fine mesh, it does absolutely nothing for our walled garden, but so

far all our carrots have been free from damage. If you are struggling with carrot fly it might be an idea for next year...

Do remember to keep picking any peas and beans that you might have, as you want to trick the plants into producing pods for as long as possible, when they have finally have had enough cut the plants off at the base and leave the roots in the soil. Legumes are nitrogen fixers and you will give your soil a boost if you leave the roots in.

Keep an eye out for the dreaded blight, as I write this both our potatoes and outdoor tomatoes are showing signs, if anyone has any blight tips or treatments we would love to hear them! If your potatoes show signs of blight cut off the tops and destroy them accordingly, with tomatoes I would remove any leaves that show signs of blight and just hope you can get them to ripen before it affects the fruit. Do think about setting any seeds for the autumn, we have grown our potatoes in large galvanised tubs so will be planting lots of autumn friendly carrots in those as soon as the potatoes are out. Now is the time to order onion and garlic sets so pop them on your to do list!

In the fruit garden your strawberry plants will be looking a bit sorry for themselves, so cut all the foliage down and remove the old straw. Do set any wanted runners and take off any you won't use. We tried a new variety this year which did not live up to expectations, so will be removing those new plants and setting more Cambridge favourite that just did so well this year. We have been much more aware this year of which plants are thriving in their positions, it's back to right plant right place. So the lavender bushes we had at the front of the walled garden looked sorry for themselves, we've replaced them with Nepeta which is happily romping along! I would suggest taking a moment this month to have a proper look at which plants are thriving and which are failing in the borders; it just might be a case of right plant wrong place!

This month's question is from Kay Ward who asks when the best time to take pelargonium cuttings is. August is a great time, just make sure the cuttings are kept damp and that you use a really sharp knife, also don't forget to label your cuttings... one pelargonium cutting looks very much like another! Good Luck!


