Nature Watch - Waxwing

This winter, birdwatchers have enjoyed a large invasion of waxwings. They are colourful birds, and are roughly about the same size as a starling. They have a warm-brown coloured head with a neat little crest on top. They also have a small black bib, and a yellow band across the tip of their tail. They breed in the birch and pine forests of Scandinavia . However, when the berry crop fails across Northern Europe they are forced in huge numbers to fly westwards in search of food. Although most of them have now moved well inland, you may still be lucky enough to get one visiting your garden.

Another bird here in good numbers this winter is the shore lark. Like the waxwing, they are also from Northern Europe. They are skylark size, and have yellow and black markings on their head. They are also known as horned lark, for during the breeding season they have two small black feathers on their head which look like horns. Although many have moved on, you should still be able to find a few of them wintering around the Holkham Bay area.





This was an exercise in humiliation, but by oblique intervention your writer was able to have the board removed and it did not re-appear whilst the work proceeded for several more days. Writings to the Home Secretary and Prime Minister are in preparation. NOT IN THIS VILLAGE PLEASE!

The stacking of coffins in the Church porch are soon to be a thing of the past. Planning consent has finally been given for the extension to the Churchyard which will provide plots for the departed for years ahead. Odd in a way, because the village has actually shrunk in recent years but perhaps the queue was longer than thought. For those who sleep lightly the reference to piles of coffins should be seen as a comic reference...probably!

We wish Marion Harrison God Speed. The Rectory may be let, because it is planned that Itteringham will join the Aylsham group of parishes.

The Churchyard, St Peter's, Corpusty



Recent repairs to St Peter's – largely paid for with grants specifically for redundant churches – have put the church into a structurally sound condition, with a new roof, repairs to the stone tracery, glazing to the windows instead of sheets of corrugated iron, and new gutters and downpipes.

When the church was declared redundant by the diocese, it was originally taken on by The Friends of Friendless Churches. It was in a precarious condition, with the windows, chancel screen and font smashed by vandals. Forty years ago, urgent repairs were carried out and access to the church restricted by new gates. The church was then transferred to The Norfolk Churches Trust, which has

organised the recent work, and has been investigating appropriate uses for the building.

For sixty years the churchyard has been neglected, allowing scrub to take over and self-sown ash, oak and thorn to become established. Rabbits have burrowed beneath the headstones, toppling some of them. Nothing was done to maintain the churchyard, because there was some doubt about which body was responsible. Only the church itself is in the care of the Norfolk Churches Trust. The Parish Council owns and manages the extension to churchyard, where burials continue to take place. The Diocese has now confirmed that it owns the churchyard immediately around the church and that responsibility for it therefore rests with the churchwardens of Saxthorpe (although during the last fifty years this was never made clear).

There is, fortunately, a remarkably complete record of what the churchyard has looked like since the middle of the nineteenth century. There is a watercolour of the church by Miles Edmund Cotman (1811-1858) showing the churchyard completely open and without trees. Photographs taken in the early 1900s show it still in good order, surrounded by grass. Forty years ago, it was still remarkably open, with virtually no trees. The views from the church were impressive, and it was a much more prominent landmark in its commanding position above the village.

A group of local people has agreed to pay for clearing the churchyard. Thorn and scrub will be cleared and self-sown trees will be removed where these threaten to damage the church or the headstones. There is, for instance, a young ash growing in the masonry of the boundary wall – which is probably medieval – on the south side of the church, and that will come out. Some of the older trees, including those with bat boxes, will remain. The brambles and bracken will also be cleared and the area returned in due course to mown grass.

The intention is that this work will be carried out early in the New Year. If anyone wishes to discuss it with me, or would like to see photographs of what the church used to look like, please give me a ring. Donations towards this long over-due work will be gratefully received, and we would welcome volunteers to help with future maintenance.


