

My Dear Friends

Sundays Only?

Thank goodness we are not a 'Sundays Only' Benefice - this is very much at the front of my mind in the month of May. There's always a good attendance at the Wednesday morning Eucharist at Saxthorpe, and a faithful few gather at Matlaske on Thursday mornings.

The most important weekday is on May 10^{th} - ASCENSION DAY. We shall celebrate Jesus' ascending into Heaven with a service at 10am at Matlaske. It would be most encouraging to see a good number of you on Thursday 10^{th} May at that service.

May also sees two really important celebrations in the Church calendar - Whit Sunday (20^{th}) when we celebrate the light of the Holy Spirit - and Trinity Sunday (27^{th}) when we rejoice in the mystery of God's love - Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Of course, the title of this little letter - 'Sundays Only?' - applies to the whole of our Christian life. 


May Feast


Toad Migration Report

Parish Council News

Alastair Brown has announced his resignation as chairman of Plumstead Parish Council. He has been a councillor for 7½ years and Chairman for 3½ years. It should be noted that parish councillors are unpaid volunteers working for the benefit of their community. Alastair took over as Chairman at a difficult time when there were only two councillors remaining and difficult decisions to be made, in particular in regard to the upkeep of the Pond at Plumstead Green, the wildlife area around it and the adjoining meadow planted with wildflowers. Working around this problem (and many others) has taken much time with Alastair shouldering the bulk of the load. He has also been at the forefront of the physical work of managing the pond area, organising working parties, mowing grass and painting wood preserver on the fences. He leaves the council with four councillors, none of whom want his job! The formidable task of carrying on his work has just begun. Recipe of the Month



I'm afraid I really did speak way too soon in my last column regarding the arrival of Spring! Finally, it has arrived now... what a relief! I think we have managed to stoically make our way through an extra month of winter this year. Gardening is at times an act of faith – or misguided optimism!

Let's start in the veg patch. Hopefully you will have set your potatoes already, but if not it's time to get them in the ground. Don't forget to keep earthing them up. Potatoes need protecting from frost. A bit of frost damage won't kill them, but it will set them back which would be a shame. Are you the happy owner of an asparagus bed? With any luck you should have some spears showing. Do keep your eyes peeled for violet root rot, a really unpleasant disease. The above-ground symptoms are that the leaves turn yellow and die. Remove any infected plants if you have a severe attack you will need to start your bed again and leave your old bed empty and clear for three years. If a mild attack you could get away with isolating healthy plants with vertical pieces of corrugated plastic. If you have young broad bean plants, then as soon as they start to flower you will need to pinch out the tops. Black fly find this part of the plant irresistible, but if you remove the tops you won't have a problem. Your next job in the veg patch is to get the hoe out, roll up your sleeves and keep on top of the weeds... little and often is the best way.

Now for the flower garden! I am a big fan of dahlias. If, like me, you are adding to your collection, then May is a good time to plant them out. My particular favourite is 'Rip City', a wonderful prolific engine of a plant with beautiful deep crimson black flowers... an absolute winner! Another beauty is 'Thomas Edison' – less prolific than 'Rip City', but a stunner!

Lawnwork: regular cutting is a must, and May is also the month where you can drop blades for a closer cut.

This month's question is from William Stroker, who has a nasty case of blanket weed in his pond. Don't worry William, help is at hand! All you need is some patience and a stick or rake to remove it. If your pond is in full sun, then consider providing some planted shade to help prevent it in the future.



It has dark greenish feathers on its body that shimmer with iridescent colours in the sun, making it quite a beautiful bird to see in sunlight. Its flight is rapid, with strong wingbeats and it will dive and swerve with ease in the sky. I used to see really large flocks of lapwings over the fields when I was a boy and they would especially show up against a dark sky with the white of their underside.

In Norfolk they are now largely confined to managed nature reserves, but in the 18th and 19th centuries lapwings were so numerous that their eggs were collected from marshland in their thousands and sold in London markets as delicacies for three shillings a dozen.

Now, numbers in the UK are around 140,000 pairs, with 650,000 wintering. The highest accumulations are centred around the Somerset Levels and the Humber and Ribble estuaries, and the RSPB have reported that numbers of breeding lapwings are going from strength to strength on the marshes at RSPB Malltraeth Marshes on Anglesey in north Wales.
