

Dear All

What makes a saint? We can quite easily say "so and so is a saint", often attributing to them qualities such as kindness, gentleness, generosity, patience. Within the church a life of holiness is revered: a life rooted in disciplined prayer radiating the love of God. Somehow, we do know when we are in the presence of someone who is saintly, as they seem to radiate this love, which touches us and others deeply. Mother Theresa is an obvious example, as she inspired millions with her work among the poor. Yet many saints are not publicly known, their work is humble, quiet, and Godly. Perhaps a quality of a saint is indeed humility.

Writing this in mid-May, I was struck by the death of someone who for many was considered a saint, and was certainly an inspiration. Jean Vanier, a Roman Catholic born in Geneva in 1928, founded L'Arche. L'Arche came about following a visit to the French town of Tosly Breuil, a centre for adults with intellectual disability. Vanier was inspired, and felt called, by God, to live with the poor as a family in the name of Jesus, and not just 'do good'. On visiting another community in France, he found 80 men with learning difficulties in an institute fit for only 40 people. With two of these residents he found a dilapidated house and formed L'Arche (the Ark), that became the home to countless 'fragile individuals' who may have been otherwise placed in an institution. Slowly his vision spread and L'Arche communities were set up by Anglicans and even a disciple of Ghandi visited Vanier and an inter-faith L'Arche was formed in Bangalore. For Vanier L'Arche was a place where people with a disability found for a 'real encounter' as they were valued, cherished and loved.



If you are in one of our churches during these weeks following Easter you will see a pink and purple candle lit; this candle was made by the L'Arche Community in South London. Its presence is a reminder that the light of Christ revealed in the mystery of the resurrection of Jesus at Easter is not for the few, but for the many. It points to a powerful image that whoever we are, wherever we may be, and whatever we may be encountering, we are equally loved, cherished and welcomed by God.



Recipe of the Month



Sweet Potato & Cod Thai Curry In a hurry but fancy a curry? Then use these frozen ingredients

> 2 tbsp oil 100g frozen chopped onions 1tsp frozen chopped ginger 2tbsp frozen Thai herbs 4 cook-from-frozen cod fillets 200g frozen sweet potato chunks 1 vegetable stock cube dissolved in 200ml water 130g baby sweetcorn, halved 100g frozen peas 400ml tin coconut milk 1tbsp fish sauce Juice of 1 lime chopped coriander or parsley to serve

Heat oil in pan and cook onions over medium heat for 5mins

Add ginger and Thai herbs and cook for further 2mins

Add cod, sweet potato chunks and stock to pan, stir, bring to boil and simmer for 10mins

Add baby corn, peas, coconut milk and fish sauce, stir well and bring back to a simmer

Cover, reduce heat to barely simmering, and cook for 15mins

Check that cod is cooked and sweet potato is tender

Stir in lime juice, serve with rice and sprinkle coriander/parsley on top

The Village Gardener To Plant a Garden is to Believe in Tomorrow



At last we are (I hope) in early summer! Beautiful June, another favourite month of mine. Now that frost poses no risk, it's a good time to plant out runner bean plants along with any outdoor tomato plants. Other veg that need attention in the garden are potatoes, ensure they are mounded up to ensure a good crop. Courgette plants need planting out too; you could try setting them in a little raised moat so they get a good soak when you water them. Finally, it's warm enough to grow pak choi and Chinese cabbages and edamame beans: oriental veg is the latest craze to hit our veg patch, an exciting new development! It's also the first year we have grown lemongrass from seed, too (a success so far). However, I would be interested in hearing from anyone that has got ginger rhizome to sprout, as so far ours has proved reluctant! Finally, do remember to peg down new strawberry runners in pots to keep your supply of strawberry plants vital. Remember, strawberries are less productive after three years, so it's helpful to be organised and keep a continual supply of plants rolling.

Derby Day traditionally is the day to cut your box trees, which means they will be smart for the summer. Any earlier and you risk frost damage. A good tip is to spray them with water before cutting them, and never cut in full sun as this will scorch them (spraying them with water will also help prevent damage from scorching). Also make sure your clippers are really sharp. A sharp cut means less surface area damage. Make sure you give the box a good feed afterwards to help them recover. Whilst I am always pro composting, never compost box clippings as they can spread box blight, a sadness you do not want in your garden. If, however, you have been unlucky enough to have had box blight, then an alternative I have heard good reports about is Euonymus Japonicus, a similar looking plant to box and it (hurrah!) is not susceptible to blight.

Finally, this month's question which was sent in by Ian Matthews, who asks what causes the tiny little holes in his salad rocket leaves? Well Ian, they are caused by flea beetles and the best way to stop that happening is to keep the plants covered in fleece.
