



# Letter from the Rector - Revd Canon David Longe 577252 / 07881 950294 / rector@matlaske.org.uk

Dear All

#### If there's one thing more infectious than a virus it is hope

These are the words of Dr Francis Collins, the winner of the 2020 *Templeton Prize*, on Radio 4. Collins is leading the US effort to develop a potential vaccine for Coronavirus. He said he was staggered to be awarded the *Templeton Prize* which normally is awarded to religious figures – Lord Sachs, Archbishop Desmond Tutu, St Theresa (Mother Theresa), and the Dalai Lama are previous recipients.

Collins is not a Bishop or an Archbishop, he is a scientist. His story is I think fascinating. He grew up on a farm in the 40s, his father was a teacher and his mother founded a drama school and he was home schooled until the age of 11. After school he studied science and found himself drawn to biology as he felt this would open the view into understanding how life works. He then began to train as a doctor.

It was during his third year at medical school when he was sent onto the wards of a hospital that a religious faith was kindled. He was visiting an elderly patient dying of cancer. She told him about her family and about her faith and he was struck by how peaceful she seemed in the face of death. After she had spoken to him, she said words to the effect of "...well Doctor, now I have told you about me, what about you? What do you believe?"


This question rattled him, and he went home to think about it. He looked at various religions and their texts and was baffled by them. He then went down the road to see a

Methodist minister, who kindly lent him C S Lewis's book *Mere Christianity*.

Lewis's book is excellent – it is also an easy and accessible read which I would recommend. Lewis urges his reader to look for evidence and to consider their conscience as a source for the moral law. As Collins explored he realised he needed evidence of God; he was also concerned that if he did become a Christian he would be called to be a missionary and would lose his sense of humour.

For me what was interesting was the evidence that convinced him, this he sets out in a lecture in 2006. First he felt there must be something instead of nothing. Second he believed that there must be something before the Big Bang. If the Big Bang kick started nature, he thought, what started the bang? Is there a supernatural force behind the bang that is not limited by space or time? If there is, can we call this God? Third, he wondered, citing Eugene Wigner (Nobel Prize winner for Physics) about the unreasonable effectiveness of mathematics to describe nature. Fourth, Collins wondered why there have to be

such precise physical constants (such as the gravity constant and the speed of light) to enable humanity's existence. God, he mused, must be 'a darned good Mathematician' and 'an incredible physicist'.

But it seemed to me that there were two reasons that pushed him into Christianity. First a moment hiking when he was stunned by the beauty of a frozen waterfall. And second, the effect of the moral law in our lives. We know what is right and what is wrong, and when we do something wrong we often look for an excuse. Yet we also do incredible altruistic acts and not just for our family but for complete strangers with no expectation of receiving a reward.

He finishes his 2006 lecture with the story of Wesley Autrey.

Wesley was on a New York subway platform en-route to work when the man next to him had an epileptic seizure and fell in front of a train. In an instance Wesley jumped down as the train approached and rolled them both between the tracks and the train passed over them. Collins quips that this was quite an unreasonable thing to do if your primary motive in life is to preserve your genes for the next generation.


Collins is focused, as so many are, at helping humanity during this pandemic. He confesses that "I grieve at the suffering and death I see all around, and at times [am] assailed by doubts about how a loving God would permit such tragedies. But then I remember that the God who hung on the cross is intimately familiar with suffering. I learn and re-learn that God never promised freedom from suffering – but rather to be 'our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble' (Psalm 46)."

I pray that the God of wisdom, compassion and love, will continue to inspire all our scientists in their endeavours and provide us all with the hope that we need during these days.



#### Post Office Lane & Great Yard



## Red Admirals (Vanessa Atalanta) Return to Little Orchard

These lovely insects with their distinctive colouring have visited this location each year since the writer's grandfather planted fruit trees over eighty years ago. We usually see them in the orchard here in late August or early September and they make a delightful sight, either feeding on buddleia or fallen plums, sunning themselves on window sills, or zooming around at high speed.

It is perhaps fanciful to believe that the current arrivals are descendants of those visiting here all those years ago, but who knows? Many of these butterflies start their journey in North Africa or Central Europe. On arrival the females lay their eggs on stinging nettles, and so it is a new crop of newly emerged insects that we see here in late summer.

Butterflies have suffered a terrible decline over the last thirty odd years. Some species are now extinct altogether, others very rare. To redress the balance somewhat our gardens can provide them with some much needed protection. If you have an odd patch of nettles please leave it, and if you have fruit trees avoid using insecticide. Our standing joke here is if you give plums or apples to anyone they are told, "If you find any bugs on these at least those bugs will be alive!"



# The Village Gardener

To Plant a Garden is to Believe in Tomorrov



Thank goodness for June! One of the prettiest months of the year! As I write this we have just had the hottest few days of the year so far, but we have also just got through a really tricky patch of sharp frosts... I do hope your gardens got through unscathed, as ours did (just about) but not without several stressful evenings covering up our tender plants. They all pulled through but with a rather trammelled, shocked look to them now. As ever, it's a reminder (to myself especially!) to go with the seasons and not fight them. I also had not used our wonderful Mulberry tree that will not break into leaf until the last of the frosts are over, again another note to self!

Now into the veg patch! This year we are experimenting with a carrot fence. Aesthetically it does nothing for our walled garden, but we had such a sorry collection of carrots last year due to a merciless attack of carrot fly, so here goes... but I will admit having a slightly wistful moment when I saw that Monty had just sowed his carrots very thinly without a horrid fence, the theory being that it is the thinning out that attracts the carrot fly. We shall see! Other jobs in the veg patch are to make sure your courgettes, squashes and pumpkins are well watered once they get going. I do appreciate watering might well be a challenge this year. As I write this, we have had no significant rain for days and none forecast for the next week or so, do try and ensure you have adequate water butts (just in case) and remember the golden rule: Mulch! Mulch! (always after a good soak) – it can make a huge difference.

Now into the flower garden. Try and keep on top of tying in climbers like honeysuckle, clematis and climbing roses. It doesn't take much of a growth spurt for them to get out of hand. All tender plants that have been waiting in the wings can now come out on display. Do use hazel supports in the flower border to support lush growth, best to pre-empt this rather than wait for the plants to crash, the damage will already be done! If you're attempting hedge work this month, then do

choose an overcast day if possible to avoid scorching the cut leaves, and make sure your shears are sharp! Saves a huge amount of effort and prevents bruising the leaves as you cut, finally if it is a hot day, dampen the hedge first – again this helps prevent unnecessary damage. Finally, do keep your grass height up during the hot weather. This helps maintain a healthy vigour in your lawn.

I hope over the next month you are able to step away from all the difficult stresses we are all under and enjoy your garden for what it is... a small place of heaven in a tricky world.

This month's question is from Hilary Watts who asks "When is the right time to cut my box plants?" Thanks Hilary. I was always told the day for cutting box plants was Derby day and I see no reason to stray from that advice! Just follow my tips for hedge cutting above and all should be well!
