

Reflection by our Rural Dean

Often when I meet people for the first time, when away from my parishes, perhaps when on holiday or at a party, the conversation invariably always gets around to what people do.

When I say I'm a vicar or priest, there is a pause, and the subject can change very rapidly, or, after that initial pause, they either tell me about their experiences of clergy or want to know what exactly it is that a priest does or what a priest is.

And often I have found it hard to explain in non-churchy terms what it is that a priest is and does; I can explain some of what my working week entails, but that's not the whole story.

I have also discovered that even many people who attend church, have some very strange and sometimes unrealistic expectations of what their priest's role should be.

A couple of years ago I was listening to the Chris Evans show on Radio 2, and the speaker for *Pause for Thought* was the Rev Richard Coles who that day was celebrating the 10th anniversary of his Ordination. He spoke about his ten years as a priest, some firsts he experienced, and some mistakes he made, he then said this about being a priest:

"Don't forget what you are really for. I'm not a Social Worker, I'm not a small business man, I'm not a project manager, nor a site supervisor, I'm not an accountant, I do not exercise a leadership style, nor do I ensure that we are fully compliant with health and safety at work legislation, I am not a caterer, not an events organiser, I am not a motivational speaker, a therapist, or a life coach, I'm an AFTER life coach, that's all, and the joy and the burden of the job is to help people to live this life more fully, more generously, more lovingly, in anticipation of the next". It is an amazing privilege to be a priest and to have been called to minister in this lovely part of North Norfolk, and to encounter and serve many, many wonderful people. My prayer is that even now God is preparing the heart of your new parish priest, and that when they are appointed, you will find that they will be one of the best 'after life' coaches that you can find!

At the time of writing we have, so far, enjoyed a beautiful summer with a short interlude of thunder and lightning last night which shook the house and left most of us short of sleep!

We have two organisations in the village which have given a great deal to Plumstead. A big thank you to those who have inspired, organised and helped. A personal thank you firstly to the Committee members of PEG and secondly to all

involved with the Plumstead 2000 Fund who have enabled some wonderful events to take place and raised money for some amazing projects - the highlight of course being the renovation of the Village Pond.

Finally, last but without doubt not least, our love and condolences go to Eileen, Martin, Trina, Chloe, Hannah, Neville, Diane, Dan, Charlly and Emily for their loss:

Mervyn was one of the very few of us who was born and lived in the village all his life. "Duke" (noone knows where this name came from) was a familiar figure in Plumstead, as even towards the end of his life he would take a stroll in his wheelchair, ably pushed by Eileen. He was born in the Dining Room in Church Farmhouse and although he moved into various houses in the Village he never moved away. He went to Aldborough School but refused the Grammar School despite passing the 11+. All his life was spent working on the local farms, for Sidney Seaman and Sir Charles Mott-Radclyffe. He worked with cattle, pigs and when tractors became the preferred means of working the land, he perfected the art and won many prizes at local ploughing competitions. He was also a very able darts player, and collected many trophies for the Norfolk branch of the Agricultural Workers Union which he represented. In his retirement, he loved working on the allotment, looking after his own pigs and chickens and growing vegetables. Shooting was also a winter pastime which he much enjoyed. With his passing, we lose memories of farming during its heyday.


Corpusty & Saxthorpe Neighbourhood Plan- Our Very Own Referendum

Neighbourhood Plans are supposed to give local areas more say in the local planning process. Led by the parish council, this Neighbourhood Plan (which has taken almost five years to complete) will be the first in North Norfolk. Following a final consultative event in Corpusty Village Hall in May, the draft plan was put out for wider formal consultation for a six weeks period. This ended at 5pm on 17 July. Well over 50 statutory bodies – as well as private individuals and companies - were invited to comment. Useful comments have been received and will be incorporated as appropriate to produce a truly final version. This will go to an official inspector for examination. If s/he suggests further changes, these will be made and then ... finally ... the plan will be put to a vote by the people of the Neighbourhood Area (broadly speaking the local government parish). This referendum will decide whether the plan becomes an official part of the planning system, expressing the outcome of extensive consultation about the views and aspirations of the local people for the two villages. As in all such referenda, a simple majority will be sufficient to decide acceptance or rejection. You can read the draft plan on the C&S website. It has some good ideas and some lovely pictures. And of course, we hope you will vote in favour of its adoption when the time comes!



Recipe of the Month

Pureed Courgettes in Cream

This simple dish can be served either as a side dish, or as a pasta/rice sauce.

4 courgettes peeled and sliced

1 tablespoon double cream

2 medium sized shallots finely chopped

Mature cheddar grated

Butter & sunflower oil

Salt & pepper

Gently fry the shallots in a mixture of butter and oil until soft. Do not let them turn brown.

Add the courgettes and gently fry for 2 minutes.

Remove from heat & add 1/4 cup of water. Cover and return to a very low heat.

Simmer gently until the courgettes are soft.

Remove from heat and mash mixture with a fork, add cream and return to low heat and stir for 1-2 minutes until the mixture thickens into a puree. Add grated cheddar, salt and pepper to taste.

To Plant a Garden is to Believe in Tomorrow

The garden in August, for me, is the time to sit down and enjoy the fruits of your labour. After all the hard work of long spring days, and an early blast of hot summer, now is the time to look and reflect on what you've achieved. This is a great chance to jot down ideas on areas of the garden that could be improved for next year, whether these are things you'd like to add or take away.

For me, this doesn't mean expensive trips to the garden centre; it's much more fun to beg, borrow and swap with other interested gardeners. Plant swaps are growing and are a great local idea. Look out for such happenings. What might not be right for your garden could quite possibly enhance someone else's. It always upsets me to see healthy plants thrust onto the compost heap; it's much better to give it a home in someone else's garden.

Regular watering for container grown plants and pots is essential in the summer months. This is when water saving techniques such as water butts and troughs come into their own. With August being the traditional holiday month, it's worth asking friends and family to water plants when you're away. Borders, trees and shrubs can all benefit from being mulched in winter and early spring, in wet conditions, to help retain moisture during the summer. Mulches I tend to use are mushroom compost, homemade compost, leaf mould, and rotted down wood chip. These will make the world of difference and help keep the weeds down. Never mulch dry ground! This will cause plant roots to come to the surface to look for water where they will be more prone to drying out.

Other jobs for August include pruning leggy wisteria growth and dead heading flowers regularly. Cut back your herbs now to encourage flush new growth before the first frosts. But for now, let's not talk frosts; let's enjoy the rest of the summer.
