#### **Sundays Only**

My Dear Friends

After many years in the ordained ministry, I am well used to that old chestnut "Sunday is your busy day, isn't it, Vicar?". I love Sundays - it is a tremendous joy to celebrate the Holy Communion and to lead other services - but Sunday is, generally speaking, the most predictable day in the parson's week.

People - those who come to church and those who don't - are at the very heart of a Priest's work. Being available to listen - visiting the housebound - taking the Sacrament to the sick - meeting couples for marriage preparation - baptising, conducting funerals - taking school assemblies attending far too many meetings(!) - visiting hospitals in Norwich, Kelling and Cambridge even. Writing sermons can also be a challenge.

Each year more and more parishes are amalgamated - lay ministry and many volunteers are much valued and needed. It is essential that congregations become more willing to worship in each other's churches - everybody needs to take this to heart – and we, as a Benefice, to use that well-worn phrase beloved of schoolmasters, "could do better". Sorry, but it's true.

There is a tremendous amount of good will towards the Church - recent very enjoyable and successful fundraising events at Baconsthorpe, Barningham Winter and Plumstead show just how many people want to help. We, for our part, need to reach out and be part of the many regular activities in the seven parishes. This is far more important than written 'mission action' plans which sound grand on paper but make very little actual difference. Why not invite a friend or neighbour to come to church with you? You remember that Jesus said to St Peter "feed my sheep, feed my lambs". That's your job and mine.

Jonathon Cooper came up with the idea of the raffle and single handedly sold over half the tickets. Carlos Garcia initiated the JustGiving page and prevailed upon his friends and clients to support it so generously. Finally thank you Emma, Karen Hall and Diana Muir for all your hard work in every area of the event. None of these people are on the PCC, but volunteered to help and without them we would not have achieved such a wonderful result. The raffle prizes and all the food and drink were donated so there were NO expenses. Again thank you to everyone.

#### National Lottery Grant

We are also delighted to announce that the church has received a project grant from the National Lottery of £95,000.00. The work at the church will start in September and should be completed by January 2019. In addition to repairing the roof, the project will strengthen links between Baconsthorpe Church and Baconsthorpe Castle with the creation of the Heydon's Walk (the Heydon family built Baconsthorpe Castle) in conjunction with English Heritage and the Norfolk Coast Partnership. A village website will be created in partnership with Baconsthorpe Village Hall, with areas for village events and village history. We will produce an updated guide book for the church, an animal trail created for children and a geocache will be located within the church. There will be bat nights to allow people to come and observe the bats living in the church. All very exciting!

#### Recipe of the Month

#### King Prawn Linguine in Tomato & Caper Sauce



250g king prawns 200g linguine 400g tin plum tomatoes 1 tbsp capers 2 cloves garlic crushed 2 tbsp olive oil 1/4 tsp dried chilli flakes 1/4 tsp dried marjoram 1 tsp sugar 1 tbsp tomato puree splash dry white wine 1 tbsp chopped parsley salt & pepper

Heat olive oil in a medium saucepan, add garlic and fry for one minute. Stir in tomato puree, chilli flakes and marjoram, cook for a further minute. Add splash of wine, tin tomatoes, capers, sugar and season. Bring to the boil then reduce heat and simmer until thickened.

In another saucepan cook the linguine according to packet instructions.

Just before linguine is cooked add the prawns to the tomato mix and cook until pink.

Drain linguine, combine with tomato mix, add the chopped parsley and serve.



Well, as I write this today we have not had any rain (certainly not in our garden) since early June. All the water butts are empty, but the peach tree and lemon tree are the happiest I have ever known them! This is the first time in my life as a gardener that there has been no call to cut the grass, and whilst it's nice to not have that chore, as I look around I would like to see some more green! One task that is not put off by the heat is to remove any old summer fruiting raspberry canes. We had a somewhat depleted raspberry harvest this year as the local deer found the new shoots particularly tasty! Last year it was the new shoots on roses... now that was a dark day. If Bambi hasn't already had a go, do prune your blackcurrant bushes (remove a quarter of the branches to make room for new growth) your gooseberry bushes will also need cutting back on the side shoots to five leaves. Last but not least, finish your summer pruning of your apple trees by cutting back all the side shoots.

Now to the veg patch! Whilst it's not been a bad year for blight, if you've had this unpleasant visitor, do remember to cut off the affected tops. The tubers shouldn't be affected, but I have noticed they don't tend to store as well as unaffected tubers. Try and keep an eye on your runner beans if you've got them: everyone loves young beans, but no one likes a present of huge tough beans.

August is a good month to revamp the herb garden. Give all your woody herbs a good trim, and they will reward your efforts with good fresh growth that will, when the thyme(!) comes, be robust enough to cope with any early frosts. The other plant that is a real joy to cut back is lavender, this ensures the plant remains compact and happy rather than going woody and dying back in the middle.

This month's question is from Ben Dover who asks what will happen if I don't get around to dead-heading my climbing roses? All is not lost, Ben! Come the Autumn you will have some lovely colour from the rose hips in your garden, or for display in your house.
