



The Village Gardener

To Plant a Garden is to Believe in Tomorrow



What an amazing summer we have had - not so good for the garden, but a proper summer to remember! However, the year moves on, and only yesterday I had the faintest hint of autumn. So, with that season almost upon us... here is what you need to do.

To get the most out of your tomato plants, pick the tomatoes when they are nearly ripe and then finish them off on a sunny windowsill. If you leave the tomatoes on the plant, it signals to the plant to stop producing more tomatoes. Also, keep on top of your beans and courgettes. At this time of year, your courgettes can be set with powdery mildew, which is unsightly but shouldn't affect your harvest. If you are fortunate to have an espaliered peach or cherry, then this is the best time to tie them in to keep a good shape.

September is the best month for hedge work. This enables your hedges to keep a nice neat shape, as there won't be any significant regrowth – and you can keep cutting hedges up until the clocks change. After that time, you run the risk of damage if we get a frost. Also, if you missed trimming up your box plants, now is a good time as it's best to cut box in shade rather than full sun so there is no risk of scorching.

Lawn work: keep going with keeping it trim. If your lawn needs a bit of TLC, then September is perfect for applying an autumn feed.

Thinking ahead, settle yourself down with a nice cup of tea and a bulb catalogue so you can choose your spring displays, armchair gardening at its best.

Now for this month's question! Brenda Blessed asks if the autumn is a good time to scarify her lawn. Yes Brenda, it's actually my preferred time of year as you are less likely to damage your lawn now. If you do it in the spring, then sometimes if you get a dry patch after scarifying it can really knock your lawn back.



Recipe of the Month

Stodgy Apple Cake/Pudding

1lb cooking apples, peeled, cored and chopped into ½ inch pieces

2oz sultanas or raisins

1oz chopped nuts

2oz demerara sugar
½ tsp ground cinnamon

4 oz caster sugar

5 oz self-raising flour

1 large egg

A pinch of salt

Apple Mix

In a large bowl, mix together the cooking apples, sultanas, chopped nuts, demerara sugar and cinnamon.

4oz butter or margarine

Cake mix

In a saucepan, gently melt the butter or margarine, then beat into it (in this order) caster sugar, self-raising flour, egg and salt.

Grease an 8" loose-bottomed cake tin and line the base with paper. Put two thirds of the cake mix in the tin and smooth over, then put all the apple mix on the top of it.

Dot the rest of the cake mix in small spoonfuls over the top of it. Bake for 50 - 60 minutes at 200C and leave in tin until cold. Sprinkle lightly with icing sugar.

Serve sliced as a cake or warmed up with ice cream as a pudding.

Meet the Neighbours - James Boyd

James is a classical guitarist, sailor, teacher, story teller and expert in the art of learning. He lives in Matlaske on the edge of the Repton Estate. The pastoral idyll outside his cottage door is a backdrop that feeds his creative work. Brought up in North Norfolk, James went to study the classical guitar at the Royal Academy of Music and there won the Julian Bream Prize (Julian Bream is one of the most distinguished classical guitarists of the 20th century). He went on to develop a solo career of international note and was recently elected an Associate of the Royal Academy in recognition of his distinguished contribution to music. His album Shapes of Sleep best captures the man and his music. It was inspired by the salt marshes of Cley and Blakeney and the music of great English composers. Selected by Gramophone Magazine as an Editor's Choice CD it captures James' poetic and lyrical playing in the setting of one of the world's great concert halls, Snape Maltings.

In 2007 James bought a classic yacht, Concord, built in 1937. He then spent two years restoring

her to her former glory. His restoration of Concord won Classic Boat Magazine's Restoration of the Year award at the International Boat Show in London. Concord is an obsession that has woven herself into the fabric of his musical career. Sea Change, an Adventure of Music & Sailing saw James travel along the coast of England on Concord, giving performances inspired by the sea. His journey created a legacy of new music for guitar and voice.

One day life changed for James. He had just given a late-night recital at the Bath International Festival when the next day his hands stopped working and he could not play the guitar. After modern medicine could not identify a reason for this he decided something in the way he was using himself was making the problems worse. He decided to rest from the guitar, learn new skills and become a beginner again. He learnt how to juggle, walk a slack line and practiced Tai Chi, Alexander Technique and cold-water swimming. After eight months James was able to play the guitar again with a new ease and virtuosity. The relief and joy of being back on stage once more was accompanied by a resolve to share what he had discovered with others. Alongside his concert career he now delivers immersive seminars that "Take the Tension Out of Learning" for school children, company executives and entrepreneurs.

James can be heard in concert here in Norfolk at the stunning church of St Mary's in Barningham. He will be performing there with international star violinist, Harriet Mackenzie, in a candlelit concert on 19 September. For more information on this unique event please email james@jamesboyd.co.uk


