#### Dear All

This is my second attempt at this letter, the first was a long reflection on the inter-faith event at Hole Farm - a wonderful affair that I really could not do justice to in the space given. I hope, however, we might be able to publish some pictures on the forthcoming Facebook page and some clips to give those who could not attend some idea of the day.



As I start to re-write, I realise that the most important thing to say - and it seems appropriate to say after a year of serving in this Benefice - is what a continued honour and privilege it is to be here. I have found our seven parishes with our 10 churches (if I cheekily count the old church tower at Edgefield, as well as St Peter's Corpusty, and St Peter's North Barningham) incredible places. Places which are so unique, holding hidden treasures of wonderful individuals who bring so much to our community life. Revealing again and again beautiful vistas of God's creation - I am reminded of the view from the Old Tower just mentioned.

I have learnt that the individual characteristics of our communities must be cherished and that the church plays a vital role to enable these aspects to flourish so that all can enjoy them. So, I end this letter with enormous thanks to all who have been so welcoming, generous and accommodating to me and my family. It continues to be a privilege to serve this blessed corner of God's creation.



Guy Fawkes Night is an annual commemoration held on 5 November to celebrate the failed Gunpowder Plot of 1605. The Gunpowder Plot was an assassination attempt against King James I by a group of provincial English Catholics led by Robert Catesby.

The plan was to blow up the House of Lords during the State Opening of Parliament on 5 November as the prelude to a popular revolt in the Midlands during which James's nine-year-old daughter, Elizabeth, was to be installed as the Catholic head of state. Catesby may have embarked on the scheme after hopes of securing greater religious tolerance under King James had faded, leaving many English Catholics disappointed. His fellow plotters were John and Christopher Wright, Robert and Thomas Wintour, Thomas Percy, Guy Fawkes, Robert Keyes, Thomas Bates, John Grant, Ambrose Rookwood, Sir Everard Digby and Francis Tresham. Fawkes, who had 10 years of military experience fighting in the Spanish Netherlands in the failed suppression of the Dutch Revolt, was given charge of the explosives.

The plot was revealed to the authorities in an anonymous letter sent to William Parker, 4<sup>th</sup> Baron Monteagle, on 26 October. During a search of the House of Lords in the evening on 4 November, Fawkes was discovered guarding 36 barrels of gunpowder—enough to reduce the House of Lords to rubble—and arrested.

Most of the conspirators fled from London as they learned of the plot's discovery, trying to enlist support along the way. Several made a stand against the pursuing Sheriff of Worcester and his men at Holbeche House; in the ensuing battle, Catesby was one of those shot and killed. At their trial on 27 January 1606, eight of the survivors, including Fawkes, were convicted and sentenced to be hanged, drawn and quartered.

The thwarting of the Gunpowder Plot was commemorated for many years afterwards by special sermons and other public events such as the ringing of church bells, which have evolved into the Bonfire Night of today.



### Flu Vaccination

GP surgeries across Norfolk and Waveney are gearing up to provide special clinics to offer patients their annual flu jab. Children aged between 2 and 10 years old will be offered the nasal spray vaccination. The adult flu vaccine is offered free to those in groups at particular risk of infection and complications from flu. The groups being offered the adult flu vaccine are:

Pregnant women
Those aged 65 or over
Those aged under 65 with long-term conditions
Carers

GPs are asking their patients to book a place in forthcoming flu clinics as soon as they are advertised. Alternatively, you can visit your nearest participating pharmacy.

A previous pilot programme showed vaccinating children had dual benefit; as well as protecting them from flu, it also protects others, such as parents, grandparents and siblings, as children are 'super spreaders' and are much more likely to infect others.

If you are not amongst the eligible categories to receive a flu vaccination free of charge on the NHS please consider visiting a local pharmacy for the vaccine in order to protect yourself and your family this winter.

### Recipe of the Month

### Veggie Chilli

1 onion, diced
1 carrot, diced
1 small green pepper, deseeded and diced
1 stick celery, diced
150g sweet potato, diced
1 garlic clove, finely chopped
1/2 tsp ground cumin
1/2 tsp cinnamon
1/2 tsp hot chilli powder
1 x 200g tin red kidney beans in chilli sauce
250g passata
1 tbsp olive oil

Heat oil in a large non-stick pan. Add all vegetables and cook 10 mins stirring often. Stir in spices, season and cook for 30secs.

Add kidney beans and passata, bring to boil and stir well. Partially cover and simmer for 30mins, stirring occasionally.

Serve in bowls topped with chopped fresh coriander, soured cream and tortilla chips.

# The Village Gardener To Plant a Garden is to Believe in Tomorrow

We seem to have rather fast forwarded into autumn this year! There is still plenty to do in the garden in November. A really good job to get done this month and especially if the weather is being less than cooperative, is to have a good clean-up of all your pots and seed trays (this is especially important for seed trays, as you don't want anything unhelpful to be hanging around for the new seedlings). These can then be packed away neatly for next year, which is a pretty horrid task but when completed leaves you feeling positively virtuous and on-top of everything! Having completed the pots you may as well move on to any cold frames you have and the greenhouse. Again, it's not the pleasantest of tasks but is a good thing to do and leaves you well set up for the new year. Moving into the tool shed (if the weather so dictates) you can keep going with your end of year tasks, brush off any soil/debris attached to implements and then run an oily rag over them, this will prevent any unnecessary deterioration over the winter and will leave you again well set up for the New Year.

If the weather gives you a brief window of opportunity, then November is the best month to set tulips (we should get a cold snap around this time that helps eradicate any diseases that might infect the bulbs) and it's worth taking the time and trouble to plant them properly deep- 6-8 inches is ideal, and a good tip is to make a note of what you've planted and where just so you can replicate or tweak your arrangement if required the following year.

If we are fortunate to have more than just a brief window of good weather, then have a good look at your veg patch. Have you been hankering for more space? November is a great time (if the weather is good) to add to any beds or borders, the soil still being workable and plants dormant. Do double check with yourself that you can manage the extra space, gardening is less life-enhancing when overwhelming, and much more life enhancing when manageable. It should be a joy, not a struggle! After all that you've more than earned a cup of tea by the fire with a stack of seed catalogues!

This month's question is from Diana Spalton who asks can you please tell me why my Bramley apples are rotting on the tree for the second year running? The tree is about 40 years old but it is correctly pruned when necessary. It sounds to me like brown rot which is a real nuisance, it's a fungal problem so it's very important to remove all the affected apples and I appreciate that in itself is a task and a half, you then need to bury all the affected apples at least a foot deep. This is to rule out any chance of passing the fungal infection on to next year's crop. I do wish you good luck with it! Do keep the questions coming in! ### Meet the Neighbours Jonathan Ward – Edgefield



I walked through the most beautiful garden to get to Jonathan's back door – flowers, herbs and vegetables covering every bit of available ground. The first thing that Jonathan told me was that he was brought up in the Cotswolds where his father taught him the joys of the countryside and the natural world which have always been incredibly important to him.

Having finished school Jonathan went to Leeds University to study English Literature and stayed there until he completed his PhD. As a postgraduate student he taught first year undergraduate students and was editor of *Poetry & Audience* magazine.

Jonathan then began his teaching career and spent twenty-one years teaching English at Dulwich College where he was Head of English for ten years. Jonathan was also an associate editor of *Tears in the Fence* literary magazine where he wrote a regular column called *Musings*. Jonathan and his family moved to Edgefield

in 2008 and he taught English at Gresham's School in Holt for seven years before taking early retirement. Now Jonathan teaches creative writing, most notably his writing outside courses for the Norfolk Wildlife Trust (NWT) at Cley Marshes where his workshops are inspired by landscape, the natural world and the seasons. Participants look at literature relating to nature before going for a walk and writing about what has caught their attention and inspired them. Jonathan has also taught creative writing at Holt Primary School and Gresham's Prep School.

Since university Jonathan has written and published poetry. He has two chapbooks published (Turning Leaves and Crossings). In 2008 Jonathan's poems appeared in an artist's book Twelve alongside original prints by Andrew Carter which was exhibited at the Eagle Gallery in London. Last September Jonathan had a joint exhibition in Norwich at the Anteros Arts Foundation with Kate Vogler (a ceramic artist) and Beth Walsh (a lace artist) called Confluence. This exhibition was inspired by the rivers and streams of North Norfolk particularly the River Glaven.

In 2018 Jonathan's first full-length poetry collection *Swallows in Late September* (Harwood & Elwood) was published and the launch was at Edgefield Village Hall. The title poem was inspired by a walk from Edgefield along the Little Barningham Road. The book can be bought from the Holt Bookshop, the NWT Visitor Centre at Cley or direct from the publisher (harwoodandelwood@gmail.com).

Jonathan is currently completing a new collection of poetry inspired by the River Glaven.
