One of the first jobs I did in my garden when I moved in six years ago was to put up a nest box. Although north-facing and away from direct sunlight is the ideal position for a nest box, I placed mine on an east-facing wall so as to be able to see it from my conservatory. Although it was still early winter, within ten minutes of fixing it to the wall, a blue tit flew over to it investigate. Thankfully, it met with its approval, and for the next two years tits bred there successfully.

However, over the last few years they have been rather hit and miss. Last year they began nest-building, but for some reason they suddenly deserted. This year it's much better news, for as I write this in early May, they have nested once again and are busy flying back and forth feeding their young. With an average clutch size of around seven or eight, the parents have definitely got their work cut out. Now, with the cold weather behind us, there should be plenty of insects for them to feed on. I did have a scare, though, a couple of weeks ago when a few seconds after I saw one of the tits leave the nest box a sparrowhawk flew over the conservatory leaving a trail of tiny feathers in its wake. Fearing the worst, I was convinced that that was the end of the breeding attempt once again. Luckily, my fears were unfounded, for later that day I counted both parents entering the nest hole.

One thing I pride myself on is that even as a child I never went looking for birds' eggs. Well, that's not strictly true. One day, when walking out of school, one of my friends approached me carefully clutching an egg in his hand. Knowing that I was interested in birds, he told me he had taken it from a nest that was in a bush in a nearby front garden. Intrigued, I spent a good hour searching every inch of the bush, but was unable to find any sign of the nest. The following day, my friend asked me if I had managed to find it. When I told him I hadn't, he burst out laughing. The egg he had had in his hand wasn't a real egg at all. It was a sweet he had bought from the local tuck-shop. I'm ashamed to say I'm still quite gullible to this day.

Reflection from the Rectory



At last, after the unsettled weather of spring, the summer is here with its promise (we all hope) of warmer days. So we can all look forward to the air being filled with the heady sent of honeysuckle and roses, the buzz of bees and a gentle breeze to cool us while we cut the grass, weed the beds and dead head as we move around our gardens. And, of course, we are fast approaching the longest day of the year.

But this month also holds the promise of celebration, as we wish Happy Birthday to HM Queen Elizabeth II. Our

celebrations within our villages can be found in 'What's On', and you are invited to join us as we wish Her Majesty a happy birthday and continued wellbeing for many years to come. Maybe you are doing something else to celebrate this great achievement of our Queen. Perhaps you have planned to go out for the day or are going to join in the celebrations in London. 



History Watch



The Shadwell Shams

William Smith (Billy) and Charles Eaton (Charley) worked in the 1850s on the Thames foreshore, and while excavating a basin for a neck dock at Gravel Lane, Shadwell, they turned up a few Pilgrim badges. Realising their value, the pair hatched a scheme to counterfeit them in lead or lead-copper alloy. The first customer to purchase their fakes was William Edwards, a well known London dealer, who paid them £400. They were revealed to be counterfeit when it was pointed out that they depicted dress and armour inaccurate of the supposed period, that their 'Latin'

inscriptions were indecipherable, and their dates appeared in Arabic numerals, when they should have been Roman. However, today, the Shadwell shams are quite sought after, and this one, found in Sheringham, was given to me by my father-in-law.



Medieval Jetton

This is a jetton which was used as a money substitute in games across Europe and Britain. I found it in Hempstead. It has the inscription 'HEIT ROTT MORGEN DOTT', literally 'Red today, dead tomorrow', or as we would now say, 'Here today, gone tomorrow'. It was inscribed by Hans Krauwinckel II. There is a small rose orb design on the reverse.



Pot Mend

This is used to fix a vessel that has a hole or break. The metal is lead. It is dated by the team in Norwich as between 1100 AD and 1400 AD. What makes this special is that there is an engraving on the outer face of the mend - a few lines and perhaps a signature. This is also a Hempstead find.

Mike Strong's Recipe of the Month



TABBOULEH

This is a Lebanese dish of bulgar wheat, really delicious for a summer evening, inexpensive and easy to prepare.

Serves 6

7 oz bulgar wheat I tsp salt 12 fl oz boiling water



For the dressing

2 fl oz olive oil

2 fl oz lemon juice

2 tablespoons of fresh mint - finely chopped

2 cloves of garlic - crushed

6 tablespoons of fresh parsley - finely chopped

1 lb tomatoes - chopped 1/2 cucumber - small dice

Method

- 1. Mix the bulgar wheat with the salt, pour over the boiling water and leave to soak 15 - 20 minutes
- Mix the dressing ingredients together (without the tomato and cucumber). Combine with the now swollen bulgar wheat. (If possible leave overnight, as this will enhance the flavours) Place in a refrigerator or cool place.
- Fold in the tomato and cucumber. 3

This is lovely served with natural yoghurt as a side dish with barbecue foods.

Jan Brookes-Bullen is one of the most cheerful women I've ever met. Which is not surprising when you realise that she is House and Collections Manager at Blickling Hall where she works in the west wing from an office cluttered with piles of books on glass and interior design. It overlooks the west garden and there is a distant view of the lake. When on night duty, she has the use of an upstairs flat and can sit in the bath and look at the swans. Working under Blickling's general manager, Jan, who lives in Edgefield with her husband David, is responsible for the entire care and safety of the hall, especially the collection but also dealing with complaints and staff training. She is accompanied everywhere by Charlie, her yellow Labrador, who is a great friend of Blickling's volunteers.

Jan rose through the ranks. She trained as a secretary in Grantham, worked as a dental nurse, travelled with her first husband in France, Switzerland and Germany, brought up two boys, now 30 and 37, and once she'd done the 'mummy thing' became a volunteer at Belton House, the National Trust property in Lincolnshire. She went on to read for a new degree focusing on the conservation of cultural heritage. She then worked at Kelham Hall and Southwell Workhouse before moving to Blickling, initially for a year's maternity cover.

Ten years later she says - and it is so obvious as she walks the hall - that she is now enjoying the fruits of her passions and desires.

One of her big successes has been the development of the volunteer teams. Altogether there are an amazing 450 volunteers, including 200 who work in 18 different teams in the house, concentrating, for instance, on the library, the collection or tours. Another has been in developing the house and the collection. Extra rooms have been opened, including those used by the Marquess of Lothian, who bequeathed Blickling to the Trust, and yet another the presentation of the collection to the media.

When she is back in 'so welcoming' Edgefield, Jan enjoys gardening and reading, but would love to start horse riding again.
