
Letter from the Rector - Reverend Canon David Longe

Dear All

It is difficult to know how to react to the events in the world since the beginning of the year. How are we to react as we watch those in political power slog it out?

While the church has at various points wielded political power, this is not its nature. We only need to remember that Jesus was nailed to a cross like a criminal, had to borrow someone else's grave, before baffling all and rising from the dead. This is not power on a political level, but on a more



profound level that we can - I believe - only experience through prayer.

Prayer is the gift we are given by the Divine. While it is easy to write off, it is wrong to do so, for prayer is revealing and inspiring. Prayer shifts our perspectives from the impossible to the possible, from the human to the Divine. It requires us to trust that God is – in the mess of all – in control.

We see this in Holy Week, which is almost upon us, with Jesus revealing who he is through the mystery of the last supper – breaking bread which he speaks of as his body; and giving wine which he speaks of as his blood. And on Palm Sunday the crowd hail Jesus as King, yet by Good Friday they shout "crucify him".

Throughout this drama, Jesus does not point to himself as in control, but to God being in control, echoed in his final words on the cross: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." (Luke 23.46)

These words show the intimacy, the trust, that Jesus has with the Father. It is to this that we are invited through prayer.

Entering into prayer does require a conscious effort to soften our hearts to the concept that there is a Divine and realisation that prayer will not always be answered as one expects. We need to forgo our egos and make ourselves at one with the interests of God.

For the church, the interests of God are revealed in Jesus. This is no guarantee of an easy life – the lives of the saints illustrate that. But it is an assurance that God is with us. To seek to encounter God in prayer is not about getting a 'handle' on God to shape our lives to our own designs. It is a selfless act to allow God to take control requiring us to enter the unknown and encounter the unfathomability of God. For God's ways (as Isaiah writes) are not our ways, God's thoughts are not our thoughts.

Does this help us when we are faced with such a moving political landscape? This question can only be answered by experiencing prayer. For me as a parish priest my first response must be prayer trusting that whatever the craziness in the world God's goodness will prevail. his is the fundamental message of Easter that God's goodness, revealed in Jesus, is more powerful that anything we can imagine.

May God be with you

Did you know that in 1865 there was a shooting at Baconsthorpe Rectory?

In that year the Reverend Arthur Upcher was shot and seriously wounded. The assailant was an orphan lad, 15 years old named Frederick Butcher. He was a nephew of the rector's coachman and while apprenticed to a carpenter in the village he was allowed to live at the rectory with the Upchers where he was treated as one of the family. Subject to sulky moods Frederick would often shut himself into his bedroom for days, refusing to join the family for meals. However at night when the family retired he would wander around the house. One particular night he went

into the rector's study and found a pistol in a drawer. The next day as the lad refused to leave his room for work the rector forced the door and the boy fired the gun. Although he was severely wounded Reverend Upcher raised the alarm and Butcher was arrested. Later when held at Holt police station Butcher insisted it was an accident, but to no avail. Later that night he was lodged in the prison at Mousehold Norwich. My thanks to Tommy Worboys for providing me with this article – I have summarised the content.

A Warning for Dog Walkers

Diana Muir of Manor Farmhouse, Baconsthorpe is appealing for information following a terrible injury to a friend's terrier. "A friend who was staying with me was walking along the track that leads from my house down to Plumstead Hall Farm with his small terrier" writes Diana. "It darted off and he thought it would follow him when he turned back but when he got to my house the little dog wasn't with him so he went back up the track and found the dog



lying on the ground unable to move and clearly in a bad way. No immediate evidence of anything on the outside but, the vet hospital in Taverham realised that he had massive internal bleeding as a result of a bad blow to his stomach which they said was almost certainly a vicious kick. Early Spring, before roadside verges and hedgerows really get growing, is the best time to deal with litter that has been carelessly dropped or deliberately tossed on

to verges. The litter pick, organised by the Parish Council, will help our villages look their best as more of us get out and about in warmer weather.

But litter isn't just unsightly. Animals, large and small, eat discarded wrappers and rubbish, which can be fatal. Glass bottles can trap small animals, and easily smash into lethally-sharp shards - not good for people or animals. And it doesn't end there. Plastic breaks down into microscopic pieces that impact on a whole host of creatures. So join us on the 5th!

Walking Our Public Paths

Parish councillors pulled on their walking boots to review the condition of all the public paths that run through our villages. A number of problems have been noted, such as the pictured broken stile at the Holt Road (B1149) end of a lovely path (FP 20) along the meadows from Briston Road (B1354). Other issues have included missing, broken or overgrown signs, and an obstruction on Adams Lane (a restricted byway). A report is being sent to County Highways.

The Village Gardener - To Plant a Garden is to Believe in Tomorrow



As I write this in the middle of March, thinking of April to come, we have had yet another sharp frost making me briefly sigh with relief that my week had turned completely to pot so that I hadn't managed to pot up my new dahlias..

In light of this I have actually decided to wait until April to get going with the dahlias, they are far far happier when it's a bit warmer and what really works best for them is good steady growth, not stop/start growth in seesawing temperatures. This means I get to prep my pots in good time, warm the compost and most importantly make decent labels for them all, that will all be then transferred to the walled garden... hopefully!

I have ordered a new variety of dahlia called 'Rhubarb and custard' which I am very excited about, it literally does look as if someone has

swirled rhubarb and custard together it's also a single dahlia and whilst I love double dahlias and all their glamour, I do try and grow more single ones just because bees can access nectar and pollen much easier. Happy bees happy garden!

Last dahlia tips...Choose the right size pot for each tuber, small tuber small pot ...large tuber large pot, basically it's not helpful for tubers to have loads of compost around them when you are trying to kick start them, so if they are looking lost in a pot downsize them. Be very careful with watering, give them a quick water when you first pot them up then wait till they start to shoot before watering again, too much water at this stage can cause them to rot.



They can be quite tough to divide so use two forks back to back to prise apart and replant the more vital outside parts of the plant and discard the tired centre, water well if we have a dry patch but they should rejuvenate quite nicely...Good Luck!

This article has been prompted by a recent unexpected four hour power cut in the village, it was then you realise just now dependent on electricity we are. How can you manage without it? Well us lot in Baconsthorpe had to wait until it finally arrived here exactly 75 years ago.

Prior to that date oil was the main method of obtaining light was with paraffin in Tilly lamps providing just enough illumination for reading and writing. Even our church needed oil lamps

which some may still remember. The accompanying photo taken from a postcard c1921 shows lamps in evidence giving the church a certain atmosphere that electric lighting could never emulate

But it was in the cooking and washing of clothes that the main changes were to occur. A wall oven heated by a coal fire was used for baking and a large copper in an outhouse had fire lit under it and came into play each Monday washday. Entertainment? No TV of course, but there was a battery powered radio to hear the news, "Dick Barton" for the kids and Mrs Dale's Diary for our mothers.

Now all those old fashioned aides were to be swept away, replaced by an electric cooker, a Burco water heater for washdays, and lighting available in every room at the touch of a switch. Some of the older residents refused point blank to have this modern 'elec-trickery' installed and so probably had the last laugh when power cuts occurred.
