Well done, all of you, for taking such beautiful photographs and especially Toby, our winner!
















The largest and rarest of our native butterflies, the Swallowtail (papilio machaon britannicus) exists only in the area of the Norfolk Broads, which being relatively close is fortunate if you ever wish to see one. This lovely insect is preceded by an unlovely-looking caterpillar, whose sole food is the milk parsley, so if no milk parsley exists, neither will the butterfly. The Swallowtail can only thrive if its fenland habitat is well managed and the reed is cut back to allow milk parsley and other plants to grow. To this end, a conservation programme has been adopted and the Swallowtail's chances of survival are now looking much brighter. I have only been fortunate to see this butterfly on one occasion, and that was during a camping trip to Horsey back in 1957, but it was an experience I have never forgotten. Hickling Broad, Ranworth Broad and Strumpshaw Fen are the best locations to spot one – try a bright summer's day in the early morning, and you might be as lucky as I was all those years ago!

#### The Season of Remembrance - Reverend Judy Rosser

#### Dear Readers

I am taking this opportunity to introduce myself as the assistant curate to our Seven Parishes of the Benefice of Matlaske. I was ordained a Deacon by Bishops Graham and Jane at Norwich Cathedral, just a month ago. The adjoining photo is of the joyful time afterwards in the cloisters with my family and friends, where the sun shone brightly for us all. The live streamed service took place in the Presbytery of the Cathedral, unusually, as Dippy the dinosaur was occupying the nave. Dippy diplodocus will now have returned to the Natural History Museum. I so hope readers managed to visit him in the Cathedral and have unforgettable memories, as I do of the Ordination Ceremony.

November is the season of Remembrance. It is an opportunity to engage with the extraordinary power of love we have for one



another, the grief of bereavement as well as honour those persons who have died in past conflicts. On  $2^{nd}$  November there will be an All Souls Service at Saxthorpe, with prayers for the deceased and a chance to light a candle in Remembrance of a loved one, with quiet time for reflection. We will be reminded that the light of Christ shines out of the darkness.

On Remembrance Sunday, six churches of the benefice will have their own service with a time of silence and the Kohima Epitaph. You are very welcome to join us.

#### Kohima Epitaph.

When you go home tell them of us and say: "For your tomorrow, we gave our today".

Bishop Graham of Norwich, Lead Bishop for the environment, has endorsed a call for churches and cathedrals to ring their bells on the eve of the United Nations Climate Conference in Glasgow, or COP26. I trust that the resonance of the bells and all they signify will be inspirational and truly worth remembering. Church bells ringing are usually associated with a call to worship or a wedding, but their other historic function is to ring out a warning. The Ring Out For Climate Change Campaign is cleverly championing the bells ringing out for 30 minutes as a warning of the climate emergency. Bishop Graham has reminded us that the bells are a sign of hope too, that the conference will lead to restorative action on all our parts, at home and in those places where climate change is ruining the poorest communities and destroying lives.

This transformational prayer which follows is being read aloud in our 7 churches and throughout the Diocese before and during the summit.


The next Film Night is on Friday 5 November when we will be showing *The Father*, starring Anthony Hopkins and Olivia Colman. Tickets £5 on the door.



#### From the Treasurer

Thanks to a grant from The National Lottery Fund, we have been able to purchase a 'fogging machine', to be shared with the Village Hall, which will enable large spaces to be disinfected, if necessary, before hosting gatherings that would involve many people. At the same time, we have acquired a contactless card reader that allows collections in church, or any other donations, to be made by credit or debit card. Collections in church (up to £20 per individual donation) thus made are eligible for Gift Aid, under the Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme, without the need for any form to be filled in. Other donations (ie made outside the church building) would be eligible for Gift Aid in the normal way, if a Gift Aid declaration has been completed. The card reader is linked to the church bank account by a confidential password, so even if (Heaven forfend!) it were to be stolen, a crook would only be able to donate money to the church!

Additional funding was provided by TNLF for casters to be affixed to the central pews to allow them to be moved if necessary, so that community events could take place in the church. A further amount was allocated towards heating the building for the rest of this year. Richard Peaver

#### **Edgefield Fuel Fund Distribution**

The Trustees will distribute a payment of £25 per eligible household in the village hall on Saturday 4th December between 11.00am and 12noon. No payments will be made outside these hours. Covid 19 requirements: face masks will not be compulsory.

To be eligible: (a) you must have reached the age of 60 years; (b) you must have been permanently resident in the Parish of Edgefield for five years and be a resident on the day of distribution; (c) you must apply in person; (d) the infirm or incapacitated may send a representative who must bring a written authority signed by the person who qualifies.

Please note that the distribution of funds is at the discretion of the Trustees. Rude and abusive behaviour is not acceptable and is likely to result in a refusal to release a payment to an applicant or their proxy.

#### Church Clear-Up

We had a clear-up day in church and churchyard on 27th September. The altar was moved forward in the sanctuary, so that the celebrant can face the congregation. This revealed, alas, several dead birds. They had found their way under the table but could not get out. The grave slabs underfoot are rather uneven, so these will need attention too, lest a human end up under the table. In the churchyard, a memorial bench was scrubbed clean (though the woodwork still needs treating), several graves were tidied and lots of dead branches were removed from the historic graves of Mr and Mrs Bumfrey, early Victorian leaders of the Matlaske Primitive Methodists.

#### **History Trail**

Plans are being drawn up for a Heritage Lottery bid for funds to create a history trail around church and churchyard, the centrepiece of which will be the grave of the Revd Thomas Settle (1555-1622), Rector of Matlaske and Barningham Winter, and author of a rather stern catechism, who as a young man was an ardent congregationalist. He was kept in prison for many years by the Archbishop of Canterbury and was lucky in fact not to be executed like some of his fellow radicals. He eventually conformed and found a refuge in this tranquil part of Norfolk (possibly with the help of the Paston family of Barningham Hall), though his strange jottings in the church register suggest a mind not entirely at rest. Either that, or he took up calligraphy as a hobby.

#### Farewell Evensong 26th October



November can be (if the weather is on our side) a great time to catch up, take stock and set the scene for the new year. So here's hoping we will have some crisp clear days to get ourselves on track!

Firstly the veg garden: last call for garlic to be planted, but the main focus is on clearing weeding and prepping beds for the next season. It's a good time to cover raised beds in organic matter so that it breaks down over the winter months. Keep clearing and tidying and if you get a dismal wet day and you still want to keep on track, then have a good sort out of your potting shed – you will thank yourself come the new year when you have lots to do outside and a nicely sorted shed to work in or from. If we are still in the shed, then do either service your mower now or get it booked in so again you are all sorted for the new year. It's worth remembering for these final cuts of the year that you can raise the blade on your mower just so it keeps the lawn in check and tidy but doesn't catch any worm casts in the lawn, that can make the lawn look muddy and unhappy. Another good tip for your lawn is to trim up all the edges; it adds a good level of definition and can make the whole garden look more together. Garden furniture can be safely tucked away now too, it's worth casting an eye over everything to see if anything needs repairing or replacing, better to do that now when you might have some rainy days to sort them out!

This month is a good time to check in with any paths you have round the garden, if they are made from brick/stone it's a good idea to hose them down and then brush sharp sand over them to reduce the build-up of algae etc.

I am sure we mention this every year, but do give some thought to setting bare root trees or shrubs, yes you have to be so much more patient but we are quite convinced that you do get a better tree or shrub at the end of it. In our experience, bare root get going much better than larger potted trees, who seem to pause for several months before they get themselves established. It's also extremely satisfying and much much cheaper! Your patience will be repaid and if you do suffer any losses, it's not the big knock-back that losing a larger tree would be.

Finally it's time to plant your tulip bulbs, a good positive job to get done which will be joy to behold in the spring!

This month's question is from Peter Davis who asks as he missed pruning his plum tree during the summer is it OK to prune it now? Sadly not, Peter! Plum trees are particularly prone to silver leaf that enter the tree through any open wounds e.g. fresh pruning cuts. As the silver leaf spores are active from September to April it's far better to be patient and wait till next May at the earliest, Hope that helps.
